More advanced practitioners need higher levels of education and professional licensure. Social work licensure requirements vary widely by state, so be sure to read about your state's requirements.Step 2: Consider a Master's Degree. An MSW can be undertaken with any undergraduate degree, though some programs may require certain prerequisite coursework in related areas, such as psychology and sociology, for applicants not holding a BSW. The MSW is required to become a clinical social worker or to work in schools or the healthcare system.It's possible to do a degree in social work and learning disabilities nursing.
