

# Download Mac Manual Restore Iphone

A factory restore erases the information and settings on your iPhone, iPad, or iPod and installs the latest version of iOS or iPod software. Get your device ready Make sure that you have the latest version of iTunes on your Mac or PC. Select Restore Backup in iTunes. If a message says that your iOS device's software is too old, learn what to do. Look at the date and size of each backup and pick the most relevant. Click Restore and wait for the restore time to finish. If asked, enter the password for your encrypted backup. If you used Time Machine to create a backup of your Mac, you can restore your files from that backup. You might want to do so after the original files are deleted from your Mac, or the hard disk (or SSD) in your Mac is erased or replaced, such as during a repair. How to restore an iPhone and use recovery mode To restore a balky iPhone, you'll need iTunes on a computer, a backup of your device's data and apps and your device plugged into that computer.
